Places to Visit

Unsurprisingly, Rajasthan offers many wonderful places to visit, with its many temples, and historical buildings. In fact, you'll struggle to choose what to visit whilst you are here!

Jaisalmer, a gigantic sandcastle that remains inhabited and has mesmerized people from all over the world. With ninety-nine bastions, the castle encircles shops, a palace and more.

Pushkar, a Hindu pilgrimage town that is home to one of the few Brahma temples, over fifty bathing ghats and over 400 temples. The main street is a long bazaar, where you can find any souvenir you can think of to bring back home.

Jodhpur, dubbed "The Blue City" for its blue-tinted edifices, Jodhpur is considered an architectural masterpiece. Visit its ever-photogenic streets and Mehrangarh, a magnificent fort that towers over the town.

Jaipur, a colourful and flamboyant city made famous by the Hawa Mahal, a pink-toned building that towers over the main bazaar. It was historically built for royal women to be able to see festivals without being on the streets.

Ajmer, famous for its Islamic heritage and for containing one of India's most important Muslim pilgrimage centres. In Ajmer, you'll find examples of Muslim architecture such as the Jain golden temples.

This schedule can be changed and/or amended depending on weather conditions, local conditions and unforeseen circumstances.
